 within DFID do meat inspection in the past; however some of those program
 areas have budget issues as well and do not have staff available anymore for
 meat inspections.
- 2. Is AURI Survey Report done? What were the results? Kathy D was checking on this and will forward.
- 3. Ryan Pesch did an Economic Impact Analysis on Farm to School. Jane said she could forward this.
- 4. Need MAMP to weigh in on this issue/topic Jon Christenson.
- 5. Rob King & Gigi's report on Regional Food Systems Jane was going to forward as well
- 6. SFA & Local Foods can poll members about unmet needs.
- 7. Can we poll where animal producers are at?
- 8. Still need plants to be at or close to capacity for processing in order to cash flow their operations.
- 9. Poultry has very few options for Equal 2 or USDA processing in MN, especially in greater MN.
- 10. As a producer, they may be willing to pay \$10/head to assist in funding state inspection, if it meant they knew they would have somewhere close to process their livestock.
- 11. Is the State committed to a Regional Food system? If so, having accessible Equal 2 meat & poultry inspection is an integral piece of that.
- 12. There is a public good to quality inspection and working to keep our food system safe.
- 13.100% of requested inspection should be covered vs. 75%
- 14. We need staff available for education and outreach to the public, producers and processors.
- 15. Why are there big geographic gaps in processing plants? Seem to be clustered around the I-94 corridor.
- 16. Regional Partnerships study should be conducted on local meat processing and its effect on the local economy. We would need to request money to do this.
- 17. Study or survey, how many local farmers have scaled back animal production due to a lack of local and/or accessible meat processors?
